

BIOGRAPHY - LI-FEI WANG, Ph.D.

Li-fei Wang, Ph.D. is a Professor at the National Taiwan Normal University, Taiwan. She is currently serving as the President of the Division of Counseling Psychology, Chinese Guidance and Counseling Association in Taiwan (CGCA). She has been actively involved in a variety of professional service activities, including serving as Secretary General and Convention Program Chair of CGCA, as well as on the Executive Board of the international section of the Division 17, APA. Dr. Wang has been very instrumental in creating and maintaining licensure status for counseling psychologists in Taiwan. She has published over 35 empirical studies and made over 60 presentations, as well as has five edited books in Taiwan and international. Dr. wang has not only provided research services as a reviewer and editorial board member in her country and internationally, she also served as an advisor/consultant/committee member of school counseling and counseling psychology policy in her local and national government. She has successfully collaborated with administrators in education to bring counseling psychologists into school systems. The program has been promoted around Taiwan. Dr. Wang also devotes herself to international work and has collaborated with American scholars to create a series of Bidirectional Cross-Cultural Immersion Programs and the first international dual degree master program in counseling psychology between the U.S. and Taiwan. She has been honored with several awards for her leadership, research, professional services, and international work (e.g., Distinguish International Visiting Professor, University of Missouri). In 2007, she received the top counseling research award, the Moo-Dou Award, from the Union of Taiwan educational associations.
